Other Notes of Interest:

Maria Holian, one of our very active and supportive members, was a presenter at this year's MMTA Conference at Grand Rapids on a subject she called: "I See..., I Feel.... , I Hear. A Multi-Sensory Approach to Piano Teaching". I am conveying her words reflecting the essence of her dissertation.

"In order to instruct my student on how to listen to their body to acquire a balanced piano technique I developed "I See...I Feel... I Hear". This is an educational hands-on course of study that integrates the visual, sensory, and auditory components of performance. In the "I See" component, the participant observes physical positions. The sensory or "I Feel" component teaches the participant to sense muscular activity through the fingertips and to correlate the sensations with the visual presentation. The "I Hear"



component combines listening to tone quality produced and correlating the tone quality with the physical position seen, and the muscular activity sensed. The teachers found it very interesting to learn how the hand was constructed and asked how to resolve unwanted movements.

I would be happy to work with teachers to explain this approach. Also, if they would like a presentation to the students of their studio, please contact Maria Holian at mholian@netzero.net."
